



Tom Brady: "I'm even more motivated than after the last time we got caught cheating"

Tom Brady is back from his four-game suspension and the Patriots quarterback said he has never been more motivated to silence his critics.

"I'm a competitive guy. I always have been," he said. "But I think you all know I was playing with an extra chip on my shoulder in 2007 after all the SpyGate stuff. Well, you haven't seen anything yet. Trust me. This time I want it even more. I think that every time you get caught cheating, you want to play even better when you get back just to try to shut people up and make them forget about the cheating because they doubt you more and more after every scandal, you know?"

Brady's teammates say they already notice a certain look in his eyes and an energy and purpose with which he has been carrying himself since arriving back with the team early Monday morning.

"I know that look," said receiver Julian Edelman. "It means he's—"

EA Sports Working to Fix Bizarre Madden 17 Glitch That Enables Jared Goff to Complete Passes

EA Sports has apologized for a glitch in this year's Madden NFL release that has gone viral with hundreds of players sharing videos of scenarios in which the game lets Jared Goff successfully throw a football to members of his own team.

"We pride ourselves on being real to the game," said Madden 17 lead designer Geoff Purveaux. "But obviously we failed here. And while some glitches are fun and entertaining—players levitating and flying and that sort of thing—Jared Goff completing passes is far beyond the level of absurdity that anyone wants to accept."

EA is taking the dramatic step of removing all of its remaining copies of the game still on store shelves while hurrying to rush out a new edition—a move that will likely lose the company millions in sales. Purveaux says the timing is not ideal, "but we have to do what's right. We obviously can't have a game out there in which Jared Goff is completing passes. It could destroy our brand."

Sources close to the Rams say Goff is trying to scoop up as many of the existing Madden 17 copies with the glitch as possible.

"He's had a rough time since being taken №1 overall," said one Rams coach. "So after another bad day, he likes the idea of being able to kick back, turn on a video game, and go 5-for-21 for 48 yards and two interceptions. It really helps him build confidence."

NFL ratings have experienced a major decline so far this season. But there are several steps the league can take right away to make its TV ratings higher than ever.
